#### **President's Report**

I hope all had a peaceful time at Christmas with their families and I wish everyone a fruitful 2013. We start the year with our biennial IsDEAS meeting in February in Melbourne. Wendy Brown along with Ahmad Aly and Gary Crosthwaite have put together a good programme that should allow the usual indepth discussion in a casual environment. I comment this meeting to you all as it has always been a very popular format.

Later in the year, in October, we will combine the other gastro-enterological surgical groups and the Australiasian Gastro-intestinal Trials Group (AGITG) and participate in two days of the Gastro-enterologist major conference in Melbourne. Each group will have a major overseas visitor and we will integrate our programme with the other groups.

We are fortunate that **Karl Fuchs** has agreed to attend as our visitor. Karl is a GI surgeon based in Frankfurt. He is the Chief of Thoracic and General Surgery at Frankfurt am Main, in Frankfurt, Germany. He was the President of the European Society of Esophageal Diseases (2010), President of the European Association of Endoscopic Surgeons (2011) and he has been on the board of EURO-NOTES since 2007.

The theme of the meeting is malignant disease, and Karl will be able to give significant European insights into the management of gastro-oesophageal neoplasia. As well he has personal experience with POEM -

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Per-Oral Endoscopic Myotomy for achalasia. The issues surrounding this procedure and the present role for NOTES surgery will be addressed during the conference. We are presently working on the programme.

2013 is the year that ANZGOSA organises the Trainees weekend. This will occur on the weekend before the combined meeting in October. Karl Fuchs will attend along with the overseas visitor invited by ANZHPBA. I am sure the meeting will be the usual high standard and be a highlight for the trainees this year.

Once again I wish promote the ANZGOSA Audit to the membership. There is more on this in the newsletter. Sarah Thompson has taken over as the chair (although having a small sabbatical due to the arrival of her first child – congratulations Sarah). We continue to explore ways to maintain funding for this very important entity. We are now an approved audit in the RACS Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Program (annual letter of confirmation to be sent out to participants in February of each year).

Later in the year we will undergo the process of selection of the trainees for 2014. This will be lead by Gary Crosthwaite and training committee. If you have colleagues interested in our programme please direct them to our website. The training committee continues to inspect and accredit the training units in Australia and New Zealand.

As always the Executive is open to any suggestions that the membership may have to improve what we can offer as an organisation.

I look forward to catching up with you in February and later in October.

#### **ANZGOSA Hospital Unit Accreditation**

We invite you to apply for ANZGOSA board recognition as a training centre.

The ANZGOSA Post Fellowship Training manual can be found on the ANZGOSA website. This document outlines the requirement to become an Upper GI training centre. .

Advertisements for potential 2014 Fellows will be placed in the 2013 February Surgical News and the ANZGOSA website. Interviews and ranking of Fellows will occur early June 2013. A matching process, taking in to account Fellows preferences and unit requirements, will then take place. Ultimately accepting a Fellow will be at the discretion of the training unit. Hospital Unit site inspections will occur once you receive a Fellow and Fellow offers occur from late June.

Please note that if a training unit requires accreditation for both HPB and Upper GI then separate applications will need to be made to both ANZHPBA and ANZGOSA.

A portion of the program will include clinical research. A successful Fellowship in Upper GI surgery will involve satisfactory completion of the curriculum requirements, completion of research requirements, minimum of twenty four months clinical training, successful case load achievement, and assessment. Successful applicants will be assigned to an accredited hospital unit.

#### **ANZGOSA Audit**

#### **REMINDER**

To further our aim of improving the surgical management of diseases of the stomach, oesophagus and upper gastrointestinal tract, the Australia and New Zealand Gastric and Oesophageal Surgery Association (ANZGOSA) has launched a bi-national audit of surgical cancer treatment for its members. The ANZGOSA Audit was officially launched on August 31 2010 through an online portal which can be accessed via the ANZGOSA website: <a href="www.anzgosa.org">www.anzgosa.org</a>. As a practising member of the Association, we would like to invite and encourage you to participate.

Participating in the audit demonstrates both an appreciation of the importance of quality surgical care in this area and a commitment to achieving such quality. Participation will be acknowledged on the ANZGOSA website and participants will receive an annual participation certificate.

Through the reporting feature of the data entry portal surgeons have access to instant reporting on key areas against aggregated peer results and be able extract their own data for personal analyses. Audit staff will also be able to provide customised analyses if requested.

Collated bi-national data will provide the ANZGOSA opportunities for research into surgical treatment in the two countries. Participants can also make an official data request to gain de-identified information from the database for their own research.

The audit is being conducted on behalf of the ANZGOSA by the Research, Audit and Academic Surgery Division of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons. **College Ethics Committee approval was granted in June 2010** and an application has been made to recognise the audit as an approved activity so that participants can use this to claim points in the College Continuing Professional Development program.

Protection as a Quality Assurance Activity has already been applied for under the relevant legislation in Australia and New Zealand. Being declared a quality assurance activity gives individual surgeons protection from having their data and/or any comparative analysis subpoenaed from the audit.
