President's Report

Over the past few months we have been involved in the selection process and matching of Fellows to training posts. I behalf of the executive I congratulate those who have been appointed and look forward to a long association with these surgeons now and into the future. The outcomes of this process are outlined in the newsletter. The executive is also exploring ways of creating liaisons with overseas units that may be beneficial with respect to continued training experiences.

The ANZGOSA audit is a major focus of our group. With the assistance of the RACS this will be a very useful tool for all of our members. The audit deals with gastro-oesophageal malignancy as well as GIST. Given the low incidence of these tumours in our countries, aside from the personal benefits to individuals, the audit has the potential to be a significant tool in assessing management and outcomes in the short and long term. The ability to access the audit is evolving to make this easier for individuals and also unit data managers. The commitment of Garett Smith and the audit committee is a major reason for us getting to this point. However it would not have been possible without the support from Novartis which has enabled maintenance and improvements of the audit.

Our next events are the ANZGOSA / ANZHPBA trainees weekend followed by the combined ANZGOSA / AGITG meeting in August. I encourage you to consider attending the combined AGITG/ANZGOSA meeting on the Friday. There will be the opportunity to be involved in multidisciplinary discussions relating to Upper GI malignancy. Professor Derek Alderson is known to many of you, and is a highly respected Upper GI surgeon from the UK. He will be an outstanding visitor both for the surgeons and on the combined day with our oncology colleagues. The Saturday (August 27) is the ANZGOSA day and the aim is for this to be informal with presentations highlighting neuroendocrine tumours, who should treat gastric cancer, technical aspects of Upper GI surgery and upper GI stricture management.

Finally, as ANZGOSA moves forward there are challenges ahead of us. To reach this point in our existence we have had great support from our major industry partners: Covidien, Johnson and Johnson Medical, and, Applied Medical. In the future we will have to find ways of ensuring our solvency by reducing the dependence on industry. Firstly, as we aim to be an independent organisation we need to explore other avenues to maintain financial viability but also our industry partners now operate under very strict compliance laws which may impact on the degree of support they can offer.

Hopefully I will see many of you at the ANZGOSA/AGITG meeting in August.

Professor Derek Alderson, Barling Professor of Surgery in Birmingham

New to the weekend this year is a "Meet the Professor" session. In an informal atmosphere, this is the opportunity for Fellows to speak with a senior colleague with an international reputation about all aspects of a surgical career in Foregut Surgery. This includes issues such as work / life balance, the role of academic involvement or not, Surgery in the UK (Derek is on the Council of the Royal College of Surgeons of England), how to get published (Senior Editor - British Journal of Surgery) and anything else that they may think relevant



ANZGOSA / AGITG Meeting

We have a great opportunity to provide an educational programme for the members of ANZGOSA.

We have linked with the Australasian Gastro-intestinal Trials Group (AGITG) to bring Professor Derek Alderson to Australia to attend the AGTIG Annual scientific meeting. Derek Alderson is the Barling Professor of Surgery and Head of the surgical unit at the University of Birmingham. He holds an honorary appointment as a consultant surgeon with University Hospitals Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust based at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital. Before moving to Birmingham in 2005, he was Professor of Gastrointestinal Surgery and Head of Teaching in the Department of Clinical Sciences at South Bristol. He has held Visiting Professorships at the Universities of Edinburgh, Adelaide and Cape Town

He has held a variety of managerial and executive appointments locally and nationally including: Senior Tutor responsible for professional behaviour within the College of Medical and Dental Sciences, Clinical Director for Surgery at United Bristol Healthcare Trust, Programme Director for surgical training in the South West region (Chairman of the Oesophago-gastric sub-group of the National Cancer Research Institute) and President of the Association of Upper Gastrointestinal Surgeons of Great Britain and Ireland from 2000–2002. He is currently a Member of Council of the Royal College of Surgeons of England, a Member of Council of the Medical Defence Union, Non-executive director of Sandwell and West Birmingham NHS Trust, a General Surgery Expert member of UK Advisory Panel for Healthcare Workers infected with blood borne viruses, and Joint Editor in Chief of the British Journal of Surgery.

He qualified from the University of Newcastle-upon-Tyne and trained in the Northern Region and in the United States of America. His research interests lie in the field of oesophgo-gastric surgery and particularly upper gastrointestinal cancers. This has included extensive laboratory work related to tumour suppressor genes, growth factors, mechanisms of invasion and most recently, tumour metabolomics. He has published widely on clinical topics particularly related to tumour staging by endoscopic ultrasonography and laparoscopy as well as quality of life assessments. He is currently the principal surgical investigator for two multi-centre trials in the UK involving surgery and chemotherapy in patients with oesophageal and gastric cancers.

Professor Alderson is committed to improving surgical standards at all levels through education, research and clinical performance. Outside work his hobbies include diving, walking and wine, depending upon temperature, location and time of day.

ANZGOSA will have a combined day with AGITG focused on the management of Upper GI cancer on Friday August 26. On Saturday August 27, we will have a one day programme dealing with other problems relating to the Upper GI region. The AGITG meeting runs from August 24 - 26 and is being organised by that group. The "stand alone" component for ANZGOSA on Saturday August 27 will be at the same venue, the Hilton on the Park, Melbourne.

ANZGOSA Audit

Reminder - ANZGOSA Audit now up and running

To further our aim of improving the surgical management of diseases of the stomach, oesophagus and upper gastrointestinal tract, the Australia and New Zealand Gastric and Oesophageal Surgery Association (ANZGOSA) has launched a bi-national audit of surgical cancer treatment for its members. The ANZGOSA Audit was officially launched on August 31 2010 through an online portal which can be accessed via the ANZGOSA website: www.anzgosa.org. As a practising member of the Association, we would like to invite and encourage you to participate.

Participating in the audit demonstrates both an appreciation of the importance of quality surgical care in this area and a commitment to achieving such quality. Participation will be acknowledged on the ANZGOSA website and participants will receive an annual participation certificate.

Through the reporting feature of the data entry portal, currently under development, surgeons will have access to instant reporting on key areas against aggregated peer results and be able extract their own data for personal analyses. Audit staff will also be able to provide customised analyses if requested.

Collated bi-national data will provide the ANZGOSA opportunities for research into surgical treatment in the two countries. The precise details of this research are yet to be determined but will not identify either surgeons or patients. Participants can also make an official data request to gain de-identified information from the database for their own research.

The audit is being conducted on behalf of the ANZGOSA by the Research, Audit and Academic Surgery Division of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons. College Ethics Committee approval was granted in June 2010 and an application has been made to recognise the audit as an approved activity so that participants can use this to claim points in the College Continuing Professional Development program.

Protection as a Quality Assurance Activity has already been applied for under the relevant legislation in Australia and New Zealand. Being declared a quality assurance activity gives individual surgeons protection from having their data and/or any comparative analysis subpoenaed from the audit.
