#### **President's Report**

In February we had the biennial IsDEAS meeting in Melbourne and this was great success. We had an executive meeting on the day prior to the conference and elected our first Life Member – Professor Glyn Jamieson. Glyn is well known to us in both countries as well as having a considerable international reputation in the surgical management of benign and malignant disease of the oesophagus. He started the IsDEAS meeting in 1998, so it was very appropriate to announce his life membership at the dinner of the 8<sup>th</sup> IsDEAS meeting. At this meeting Anthony Farus, a medical student from South Australia, was awarded the Glynn Jamieson prize in the free paper section of the meeting.

The progamme for the "Federation Meeting" (that is the combined GE surgical groups and the Gastroenterological society of Australia along with input from Australasian Gastro-intestinal Trials Group (AGITG)) in October is complete and the registrations are now open. Ahmad Aly has worked very hard to put together a programme that will be of significant interest to our membership. Karl Fuchs, a GI surgeon based in Frankfurt, Germany, is our invited guest. He is the Chief of Thoracic and General Surgery at Frankfurt am Main. He was the President of the European Society of Esophageal Diseases in 2010. (2010), President of the European Association of Endoscopic Surgeons (2011) and has been on the board of EURO-NOTES since 2007.

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Along with managing malignancy in the Upper GI tract he has personal experience in Per-Oral Endoscopic Myotomy (POEM) for achalasia as well as knowledge of the issues surrounding the present role for NOTES surgery in Europe in 2013. I encourage you all to consider coming to this meeting. It was a great success four years ago when all the groups met in Sydney.

Karl will also attend the trainees' weekend that is held just before the Federation meeting. The Chair of our training committee, Gary Crosthwaite is working on the programme at this time. I am sure it will be the usual success for both the ANZHPBA and ANZGOSA trainees. Interviews and selection of the 2014 trainees will be held soon. The ANZGOSA Fellow position at Newcastle upon Tyne, England, is available for 2014 with the selection process currently underway.

The ANZGOSA Audit now has around 650 cases registered. We are about to do our first institutional data download. Once this has been performed successfully we have two more institutions that will be including their data in the audit. Letters of participation have been sent to those surgeons who are adding their cases to the audit.

We have established the ANZGOSA Blog through the website. Ross Roberts is monitoring this facility.

I have just presented an overview of the first five years of ANZGOSA at the RACS ASC. We have come a long way in that time. I will have the presentation added to our website for those who may be interested.

As always the Executive is open to any suggestions that the membership may have to improve what we can offer as an organisation.

I look forward to catching up with you in October.

# **ANZGOSA Audit**

#### **REMINDER**

To further our aim of improving the surgical management of diseases of the stomach, oesophagus and upper gastrointestinal tract, the Australia and New Zealand Gastric and Oesophageal Surgery Association (ANZGOSA) has launched a bi-national audit of surgical cancer treatment for its members. The ANZGOSA Audit was officially launched on August 31 2010 through an online portal which can be accessed via the ANZGOSA website: <a href="www.anzgosa.org">www.anzgosa.org</a>. As a practising member of the Association, we would like to invite and encourage you to participate.

Participating in the audit demonstrates both an appreciation of the importance of quality surgical care in this area and a commitment to achieving such quality. Participation will be acknowledged on the ANZGOSA website and participants will receive an annual participation certificate.

Through the reporting feature of the data entry portal surgeons have access to instant reporting on key areas against aggregated peer results and be able extract their own data for personal analyses. Audit staff will also be able to provide customised analyses if requested.

Collated bi-national data will provide the ANZGOSA opportunities for research into surgical treatment in the two countries. Participants can also make an official data request to gain de-identified information from the database for their own research.

The audit is being conducted on behalf of the ANZGOSA by the Research, Audit and Academic Surgery Division of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons. **College Ethics Committee approval was granted in June 2010** and an application has been made to recognise the audit as an approved activity so that participants can use this to claim points in the College Continuing Professional Development program.

Protection as a Quality Assurance Activity has already been applied for under the relevant legislation in Australia and New Zealand. Being declared a quality assurance activity gives individual surgeons protection from having their data and/or any comparative analysis subpoenaed from the audit.
